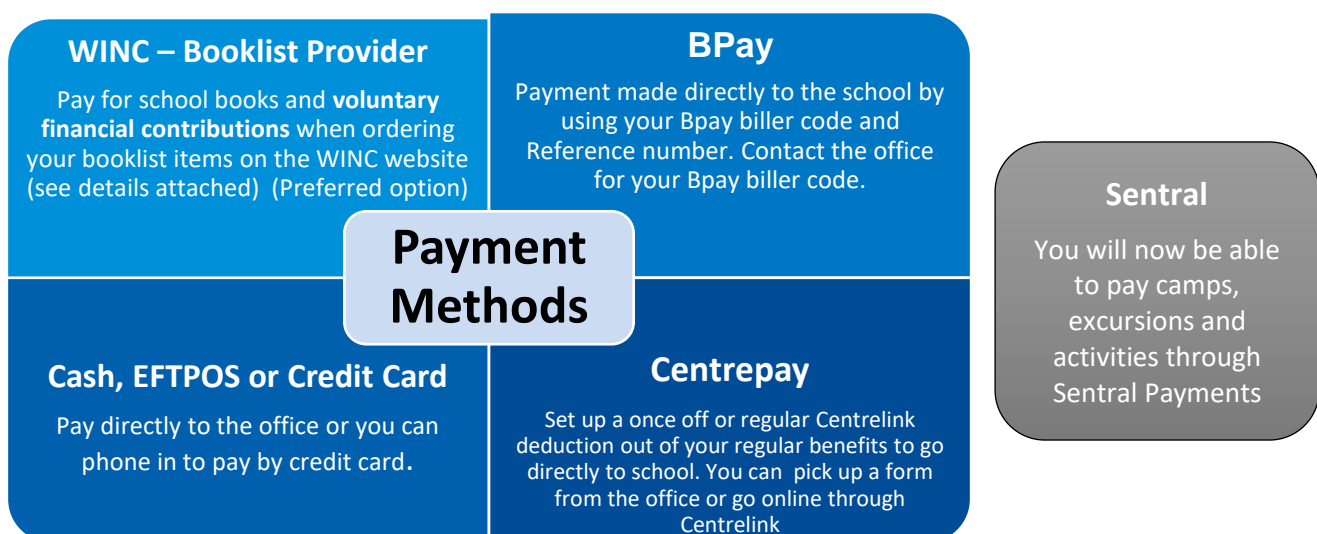

Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that's through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

Within our school this support has allowed us to financially support learning programs and to maintain and develop our school's buildings and grounds. Without your curriculum and other voluntary contributions we wouldn't be able to provide the quality learning programs in a safe and stimulating environment that we take pride in.

Ocean Grove Primary School is a **non-profit organisation**. The difference between funds provided by the Department of Education and Training through the Student Resource Package and those required for this school to operate to the high standard we expect, leaves a shortfall which our School Council attempts to raise through fundraising, and the voluntary financial contributions which are detailed in Table 1 on page 4.

We use an online purchasing system through WINC for our book packs, where you can also pay for any voluntary contributions and some extra-curricular items and activities as well. Information is attached to this letter showing how to order. Book packs are then delivered to your home during January. School Council support using WINC in line with COVID-19 restrictions with social distancing, parents on site and staff working in close proximity when serving parents. Parents are able to purchase through another supplier if desired.

PARENT PAYMENTS POLICY

ONE PAGE OVERVIEW



FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.



PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

- Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

- Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
